Recycling

When recycling, please make sure that all containers have been rinsed properly and no product is left in the containers. If the container contains product, that container may not be used for recycling and would end up in a landfill. Also make sure that anything placed in the recycling bins is recyclable. If you are unsure check the County of Paintearth No. 18 website, under waste, and there is a list of products which are acceptable or ask the Attendant on site.

Propane Bottles and Aerosol Cans

Propane bottles of any type **Do Not Go Into The Metal Piles.** Each Transfer Station has a designated area for propane bottles. By putting the propane bottles into any other area creates a hazard to people who are working at the sites or residents who use the sites. Aerosol cans such as WD40, insect repellents and wasp sprays are also not to be placed in metal piles or paint recycling containers. These aerosol products must be taken to the Household Hazardous Waste Roundup held yearly in the spring. Again, by putting these materials in metal piles or paint bints there is a risk of serious injury to someone.

Railway Right of Way

The railway right of way is solely for the purpose of a utility corridor and not for recreational use. This is just a reminder that the right of way should not be used by ATVs, snowmobilers or vehicles.
